I've been struggling a bit with whether there is still an important insight in the substance narrative, even if it isn't exactly right. For instance, in relationship, isn't it important for me to assume that my present knowing of you doesn't "sum up" or encapsulate the whole of who you are? If I treat someone as nothing more than how they appear to me -- my knowledge of them -- I think we run into ethical issues, among other things...

Any kind of looking manifests knowing? and looking at how we know allows knowledge to be recognized as being on both sides of the looking?

from Bruce to Everyone:

from Michael Gray to Everyone:

Bruce, I like the way you see in the impulse to attribute substance (standing beneath how we interpret something) a gesture that tries to acknowledge the mysterious unknown. And as you say, it's doesn't quite manage to capture what we would like to discover.

Yes, that's what I'm getting at -- the substance thing-narrative might not be right -- but there is a recognition of the unknown
